NOTICE OF RIGHT TO REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION

If you have a disability and you need:

- ◆ A change in the rules or policies or how we do things that would make it easier for to live here and use the facilities or take part in programs on site,
- ◆ A change or repair in your unit or special type of unit that would make it easier for you to live here and use the facilities or take part in programs on site,
- ◆ A change or repair to some other part of the housing site that would make it easier for you to live here and use the facilities or take part in programs on site, or
- ◆ A change in the way we communicate with you or give you information,

You can ask for this kind of change, which is called a REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION.

If you can show that you have a disability and if you request is reasonable, if it is not too expensive, and if it is not too difficult to arrange, we will try to make the changes you request.

We will give you an answer in 21 days unless there is a problem getting the information we need or unless you agree to a longer time period. We will let you know if we need more information or verification from you or if we would like to talk to you about other ways to meet your needs.

If we turn down your request, we will explain the reasons and you can give us more information if you think that will help.

If you need help filling out a REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION REQUEST FORM or if you want to give us your request in some other way, we will help you.

You can get a REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION REQUEST FORM at the Housing Authority located at 200 Elm Street North in Twin Falls or download from our website www.TFHA.com.

For lease violation or eviction:

If this problem is as a result of a disability, you have the right to a reasonable accommodation – some plan that would enable you to meet the terms of your lease. If you think such a plan or change is likely to correct the problem, you can call the housing authority office within 14 days of notice of lease violation or eviction. If you make such a request, you will need some evidence that the problem was caused by the disability and that the plan is likely to work. If it involves someone else, you need evidence that they will provide the assistance.
